# R+ Dog Training

---

Training the R+ way will always set you and your dog up to succeed, and having the best equipment will help you on your way to having a dog that is comfortable learning and that you can take anywhere in safety.

## Leads and Collars



You will need as a minimum, a plain lead and flat or rolled collar. If you have a Dachshund, or if your vet has recommended it to help with a musculoskeletal problem, please use a well-fitting harness with a back clip instead of a collar.


Choose a lead that is as light as possible so that it is comfortable for you and your dog. The collar should be tight enough to allow you to slip two fingers underneath to make sure that it is comfortable and your dog cannot back out of it. Remember that the law requires your dog to wear a disc engraved with your FULL address and postcode.

## Dispensing Treats



You will need to bring plenty of treats that you can dispense quickly and easily. A bait bag is really useful for dry treats and it has lots of handy storage pockets for keys and waste bags. Choose one with a wide mouth that you can get your hand into easily and that you can close so that the treats do not get wet in the rain or spill.

A silicone bait pouch is useful for meaty, greasy treats and is easy to clip on and clean.



A long line is essential when training for recall. I recommend one that is made from coated webbing which is light and very easy to care for. This type is safe to use without gloves, but gloves are essential when using webbing, rope or nylon long lines as they can cause very nasty burn injuries to bare skin if your dog moves suddenly. 10ft is plenty; longer lines are much harder to manage. Make sure that you have a reliable clip on the end too.
